# TANKLESS VS TANK HOT WATER HEATER

**SMALL** 

- Up to 30" tall & 50 lbs.
- Tankless water heaters are suitcase-sized & hung on a wall.

BIG

- Sized up to 60" tall & 300 lbs.
- Tank water heaters need a closet-sized space.

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# COST

SIZE

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- Tankless water heaters are more expensive to install, and may require extra vent and gas lines.
- But over the life of the unit, tankless heaters can save up to 25% in energy costs.
- Tank water heaters are less expensive to buy and easy to install.
- But long-term, tank heaters will use more energy every month to keep water heated 24/7.

**UNLIMITED** 

### **CAPACITY**

40 - 50 GALLONS

For higher use homes, multiple tankless heaters may be necessary to keep up with multiple sources, but the units will only heat water when needed.

This can increase with a large capacity tank, but a larger tank capacity will use more energy and cost more to run, as it heats that additional water constantly.

# **FLOOD RISK**

Tankless water heaters hold no water, so water damage risk or leaks is minimized.

Tank water heaters hold large amounts of water, which can cause water damage if leaking.

With proper maintenance, tankless models will last 2-3 times longer life than tank water heaters.

Traditional tank water heaters are replaced more often than tankless models.
